THE COMMUNITY

Located in Southern New Hampshire, Merrimack High School serves the town of Merrimack, New Hampshire. The current population estimates are approximately 26,000 (2018). MHS enrolls around 1200 students in grades nine through twelve. MHS is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. Students at MHS run on a modified block schedule with two semesters of two quarters.

THE CURRICULUM

<u>Foundation (FD)</u>: To develop and refine thinking, reading, verbal, writing, study skills and content knowledge; to apply skills to assignments and/or problems; to prepare students who plan to further their education or enter the world of work.

<u>Comprehensive (CM)</u>: To develop higher level thinking, reading, verbal, writing, study skills, and content knowledge; to develop abstract,

complex language and concepts through application to problem solving; to prepare students who plan on post-secondary education at a four-year college or university.

Honors (H): To develop advanced thinking, reading, verbal, writing, study skills & content knowledge; to develop understanding of complex concepts; to complete extensive investigating of subject matter; to use sophisticated language and to prepare students who plan on post-secondary education at a four-year college or university. 23 Courses offered.

Advanced Placement (AP): To develop the most advanced thinking, reading, verbal, writing, study skills & content knowledge; to develop and comprehend complex concepts. AP courses are aligned with College Board expectations and offer students the opportunity to complete college-level work while still in high school. Students may earn college credit with a qualifying score on an AP exam. 16 Courses offered.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

In May 2024, a total of 134 students took 244 AP exams in 18 different subjects 84% of the AP exams received a score of 3 or higher 54 students received a 3 in any area 66 students received a 4 in any area 26 students received a 5 in any area
