<p><u>Military Machine</u></p> <p><u>Facts:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - well organized - 1st army - ferocious warrior - chariot + horses 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - could take over Mesopotamia - were feared.
<p><u>Cruelty to Captured People</u></p> <p><u>Facts:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - set fire to buildings + carried away people and goods - sent people into exile 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - people were forced to be slaves - people were killed
<p><u>Huge Empire</u></p> <p><u>Facts:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - grew so large that it needed to be organized 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - made provinces - ruler in conquered lands had to pay tribute to the Assyrian army - Assyrians controlled almost all of the Fertile Crescent

Assyrian Empire

Civilization	When	What/ History
Sumerians	3500- 2300 B.C.	-earliest Mesopotamian civilization -main city-states: Ur, Lagash, Uruk, Eridu -Gilgamesh story c. 2000 B.C.
Akkadians	2300- 2200 B.C.	-took over the Sumerian city-states -Sargon called himself "world conqueror" -1 st empire
Amorites	2000- 1550 B.C.	-"Old Babylonians" -created new capital: Babylon -6 th Amorite king = Hammurabi (1792)
Hittites	c.1595 B.C.	-"Old Babylon" fell to bands of Hittite raiders (from modern Turkey) -iron smelting -Hittites withdrew leaving Mesopotamia to the Kassites
Assyrians	1100- 612 B.C.	-fierce and warlike -used terror to govern -southern border was Egypt -controlled almost all of the Fertile Crescent under Ashurbanipal
Chaldeans	612-538 B.C.	-"New Babylonians" -drove the Assyrians out -King Nebuchadnezzar -Hanging Gardens of Babylon -defeated by the Persians
Persians	539 B.C.	-defeated the Chaldeans -King Cyrus created a vast empire -later became enemies of the Greeks
